Fawzi Haimor is starting his second season in the position of assistant conductor of the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra. Prior to his Pittsburgh appointment, he was the assistant conductor of the Alabama Symphony for two seasons. In Pittsburgh, he conducts a variety of concerts including subscription, pops, education, and outreach. Haimor has also worked with the Jacksonville Symphony, Kansas City Symphony, Amman Sympho-



ny in the Middle East, and, in Europe, Orquestra Sinfonico do Porto. He has also served as a cover conductor to esteemed conductors including Man-

fred Honeck, Leonard Slatkin, Gianandrea Noseda, Rafael Fruhbeck de Burgos, and Jan Pascal Tortelier. In the current season, his guest engagements include the Erie Chamber Orchestra and a return to the Alabama and Jacksonville symphony orchestras as a guest artist.

Passionate about the education of young musicians, Haimor was the first music director of the newly formed Alabama Symphony Youth Orchestra where he was involved in the development of a brand new premier level youth orchestra for the state of Alabama. He was also the founder and first music director of the Davis Summer Symphony, an organization geared towards the education and outreach of classical music to residents of the Davis, California, community. He has subsequently been invited to guest conduct youth ensembles across the United States. He is also a committed advocate of contemporary music and has performed works by composers such as Kevin Puts, Bela Fleck, Mohammed Fairouz, and Avner Dorman.

Born in Chicago in 1983, Haimor was raised in the Middle East and the San Francisco Bay Area. He began playing the violin at the age of four and completed his training at the Jacobs School of Music at Indiana University. Here, he studied under David Effron and Arthur Fagen as well as attended master classes around the world led by highly respected conductors including Herbert Blomstedt, Jorma Panula and Gustav Meier.

He has earned bachelor's degrees in both music and neurobiology, physiology, and behavior, and a master's degree in conducting from the University of California-Davis before completing his second master's in instrumental conducting from Indiana University. Haimor currently lives in Pittsburgh with his wife, Houda, and their two daughters, Aleena and Layla. **Christiane Noll** starred on Broadway in the Kennedy Center Revival of *Ragtime*, receiving Tony and Drama Desk award nominations and winning a Helen Hayes award for her portrayal of Mother. Broadway and National Tour appearances include *Chaplin* (Drama Desk nomination), *Urinet*-

own (Ovation Award), The Mambo Kings (pre-Broadway), It Ain't Nothin' But The Blues, Jekyll & Hyde (FA-NY award), Grease, Miss



Saigon, and South Pacific (Australia/ Thailand). She was recently featured in NBC's live broadcast of The Sound of Music starring Carrie Underwood as Sister Margaretta. She has been a frequent guest soloist as part of Bravo Broadway with symphony orchestras in almost every state in the U.S.A., as well as international appearances with Toronto Symphony, Vancouver Symphony Orchestra, Jerusalem Symphony, Sinfonica Brasileira in Rio, China Philharmonic with concert pianist Lang Lang, and orchestras in Hong Kong, the Czech Republic, and Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. She made her Carnegie Hall debut with Skitch Henderson in his last pops performance with The New York Pops and sang with Steven Reineke in Sondheim! the Birthday Concert at Carnegie Hall. She made her Hollywood Bowl and O2 Arena debut singing with Dame Julie Andrews in Gifts of Music and her opera debut with Placido Domingo in The Merry Widow at the Kennedy Center.

Noll received critical acclaim for her appearance in City Center Encores! The New Moon. Film credits include The



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King and I (Singing Anna–Warner Brothers Animated Feature). Favorite stage credits include Closer Than Ever (Off-Broadway Alliance award), Little Shop of Horrors, Mack and Mabel (Connecticut Critics Circle Award), The Baker's Wife, Into The Woods, and Carousel. She has made appearances with Town Hall's Broadway by the Year and Lincoln Center's American Songbook Series. Among her solo recordings are A Broadway Love Story, Live at the West Bank Café, The Ira Gershwin Album, My Personal Property, and Gifts—Live at 54 Below.

Hugh Panaro is currently starring as the Phantom in *The Phantom of the Op*era on Broadway. Also on Broadway, he has been seen as Gaylord Ravenal in the Harold Prince revival of *Show Boat*, Marius in *Les Miserables*, and created the roles of Buddy Foster in *Side Show*, Julian Craster in Jule Styne's final musical *The Red Shoes*, and the title role

of the seductive vampire in Elton John's musical *Lestat*. Panaro made his West End debut as Gaylord Ravenal in *Show Boat* and went on to perform the title role in *Martin Guerre*. Some



of his Off-Broadway credits include White Lies at the Triad Theater, Noa Noa at Playwright's Horizons, Heathcliff in Wuthering Heights at the John Housman Theatre, Children of Eden at the Actor's Playhouse, and Robert in Little Fish at Second Stage Theatre.

An active concert artist, Panaro has performed with numerous symphony orchestras including the Dallas, Detroit, San Francisco, Seattle, San Diego,

Houston, Calgary, and Utah and the London Sinfonietta among many others.At New York's Carnegie Hall, he had the privilege of performing in the world premiere of Penderecki's Te Deum. Panaro was a guest soloist with the Buffalo Philharmonic conducted by Marvin Hamlisch. His recordings include Jerome Kern Treasury, the original cast recording of Side Show, Tap Your Troubles Away (Herman), The Centennial (Weil), Life On The Wicked Stage (Kern), and others. His first solo CD, recorded with Sony/BMG, was released in the summer of 2007. He has also toured throughout Europe with the legendary Barbra Streisand. A native of Philadelphia, Panaro graduated from Temple University and was awarded the Boyer College of Music Certificate of Honor for his impressive career in musical theater.
