Spanish Education K-12 Program Awarded National Recognition for Third Time

The Spanish Education K-12 Program received national recognition for the third consecutive review cycle by the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL) and the national accrediting agency, Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP).

In order to receive national recognition, programs must prepare a Program Report that provides evidence of having met all requirements of the ACTFL/CAEP Program Standards for the Preparation of Foreign Language Teachers.


The program recognition report commended IUP's Spanish Education program for maintaining high standards, particularly in the areas of requiring candidates to complete a study abroad program and to demonstrate a high level of oral proficiency prior to student teaching.

The program is the first foreign language teacher preparation program in the nation to receive national recognition in three consecutive review cycles. We congratulate the Spanish faculty for their contributions in enabling the program to earn such acclaim and Dr. Eileen W. Glisan, Program Coordinator, for her leadership and for preparing the program report.






The 41st IUP Spring Methodology Conference

The 41st annual IUP Spring Methodology Conference on Foreign Language Teaching was successfully held at the Kovalchick Center on April 15. The keynote speaker was Mr. Yo Azama, a Japanese language teacher from North Salinas High School, California, who received the 2012 ACTFL Teacher of the Year Award.

His lively key note speech was followed by 12 presentations given by school teachers, college professors, and other scholars from various institutions such as Franklin Regional Senior High School, Riverview High School, Concordia University, The Ohio State University, University of Pittsburgh, and Seton Hall University ty. There were over 120 educators in attendance, including a number of IUP alumni.

Faculty Achievements and Scholarly Activities

Dr. Eileen Glisan prepared a series of 7 webinars for the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL) Professional Development Series. The topic is core (high-leverage) teaching practices in foreign language education. The webinars consist of an introduction to the concept of core practices and one webinar for each of 6 core practices, which include maximum use of target language, building oral interpersonal communication in the classroom, planning with functional goals and objectives in mind, teaching grammar as concept, guiding learners through authentic texts, and providing oral corrective feedback. In addition, Dr. Glisan presented full-day workshops for language faculty in two private schools, the Berkeley Carroll School in Brooklyn, NY, and the Charlotte Latin School in Charlotte, NC. The topic in both workshops was "Re-examining Foreign Language Teaching Through Core Practices." Furthermore, Dr. Glisan continues to codirect the ACTFL Research Priorities in Foreign Language Education Project, now in its fifth year, which seeks to promote research on areas that have been identified as national priorities for advancing language education.

Dr. Vicente Gomis-Izquierdo attended the 13th annual South East Coastal Conference on Languages and Literatures, where he presented a paper titled "La imagen esperpéntica de Cuba en *Mi tío el empleado* de Ramón Meza," which was very well-received.

Dr. Shijuan "Laurel" Liu gave a presentation titled "Teaching Content Courses in the Information Age: Issues in Design of In-class and Outside Class Learning" at the IUP Tech Day in January. In addition, Dr. Liu received the special project funding from the College of Humanities and Social Sciences for her project titled "What can we learn from successful Chinese Language learners? Qualitative research on their success." Furthermore, Dr. Liu was invited to serve as the screening judge for the first IUP film festival titled "Flick: The Fledgling Filmmakers' Festival," and she reviewed 12 submissions. Additionally, she gave an invited talk on China to a second-grade class in East Pike Elementary School on April 11.

Dr. Dawn Smith-Sherwood received the 2015-16 award in the category of Living-Learning from the Center for Teaching Excellence and has been appointed a member of Advisory Board for Living-Learning Excellence (ABLLE). Dr. Smith-Sherwood's recognition comes as a result of her work in *Piso Cervantes*, a cluster of Wallwork Hall that is reserved for Spanish majors or minors, and which is now in the Wallwork Global Awareness Living-Learning Community.

Dr. Peter Sullivan, Professor Emeritus of German, published "Fair Rosamond and Fierce Rosamund: European Models for the Older Daughter in *The Professor's House*," in the Willa Cather Newsletter, Volume 58.2, Winter 2015: Cather and Europe.

2015 marked the 25th anniversary of Germany's reunification. On October 3, 1990, after 40 years of separation, the German Democratic Republic (East Germany) and the Federal Republic of Germany (West Germany) reunited to become a single nation once again. Dr. Witthöft presented a short overview of major events in German cultural and political history between 1949 and 1990, after which Dr. Noob started the discussion of the panel of speakers. Professors from several departments, such as Dr. Paul Arpaia (History), Dr. Ken Coles (Geoscience), Dr. Steven Jackson (Political Science), Dr. Werner Lippert (History), Dr. Stephan Schaffrath (Developmental Studies), and Dr. Peter Sullivan (Professor Emeritus of German), shared their personal perceptions of the divided Germany, reunification, and the economic and political powerhouse that Germany is today (the U.S. is Germany's major trading partner outside the EU, and Germany is the U.S.'s most important trading partner in Europe). Mr. Paul Overby, German Honorary Consul and President of the German American Chamber of Commerce-Pittsburgh (GACCPIT) also participated in this event.
