

**UNIVERSITY-WIDE GRADUATE COMMITTEE**

Dr. David LaPorte called the meeting to order at 3:21 p.m.

Dr. LaPorte announced that ~~the Ph.D. in Nursing was not approved by the Board of Governors because of concerns with the quality of the undergraduate degree program.~~ **Replace with "the Ph.D. in Nursing remains at the state level."** The committee was never informed about the BOG's decision; David is going to ask Dr. Samuels if she wouldn't mind sending us the reply from the state so that the committee can see what the BOG's concerns were. The committee's concern is that we are missing something that perhaps we should have picked up or should start attending to in the future. Alternatively, perhaps their decision is something that merits a response by the committee.

Dr. LaPorte received a memo from Chris Janicak regarding Disaster Response Track in Safety Science. Back in 2002, Safety modified their MS degree to the current two tracks, one Technical Track and one Management Track; at that time, the UWGCC also approved a third track in Disaster Response which was intended for the Department of Defense. Due to funding issues, students were not able to take the third track. Now there

is a need for this track and Chris wanted to know the best avenue to take to have this put through, it was recommended to him to update the proposal and send through again.
