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<p>(A) Why is the course being revised /deleted:*</p>	<p>Background: ACE 735 was titled Seminar in Adult and Community Education since its inception in the 1980s. When the Adult and Community Education (ACE) program was moved from a classroom based format to its current online format (2011) the University Wide Graduate Committee (UWGC) required that the title of this course be changed to Analyzing the Professional Literature in Adult and Community Education. Dr. Jeff Ritchey was the author of this online course proposal and the primary contact person with the UWGC for this course. Unfortunately, Dr. Ritchey has since passed away. While I did not work directly with the UWGC on this course, I believe the rationale for the UWGC suggesting the name change was that the committee felt that a graduate seminar course could not be delivered online.</p> <p>Rationale for the proposed change: There are three reasons for this proposed change at this time: a) I believe that time and experience have shown that online learning can be just as meaningful and collegial as classroom learning. In fact, my experience has been that discussions conducted online with graduate students are deeper and more thoughtful than discussions conducted in a classroom setting. Therefore, I believe it is possible to have an online course that meets the spirit of what a graduate seminar is intended to be. b) The purpose of the course is for students to discuss current issues in the field and conduct an in-depth literature review on a topic of their choosing. These goals are consistent with the concept of a seminar. c) While the current course title, Analyzing the Professional Literature in Adult and Community Education, is descriptive, it is unwieldy. Restoring the title "seminar" reestablishes the course's identity in the curriculum as the course in which students synthesize and build upon their learning in prior courses to deepen and expand their understanding of the field to a more professional level.</p>
