## 1. Course Deletion

We are deleting the course ANTH 317 Archaeology Research Design and Analysis which is a three credit course described as follows in the 2004-2005 IUP Undergraduate catalog.

An introduction to theory and method in archaeological research through lecture, laboratory exercises, and individual projects. Provides students with actual experience analyzing and interpreting archaeological data sets.

## 2. Justification/Rationale

The revisions to the Archaeology Track in Anthropology that are proposed here make this course obsolete. It's contents have been divided and augmented by the creation of two courses that are now required. These courses are ANTH 325 Archaeological Lab Methods and ANTH 425 Archaeological Theory and Research Design. This change is being made in order to provide students in the Archaeology Track with more exposure to the various aspects of archaeological practice as explained in the new course proposals.

## 3.Effects

The primary change we expect from the deletion of ANTH 317 and its replacement with ANTH 325 and ANTH 425 is program graduates who are better prepared both for jobs in the CRM industry and for graduate school.

Students enrolled in the Archaeology Track at this time who have taken ANTH 317 already may continue to use this course to meet their requirements. Current students will have the option to take the new course sequence or simply to take one of the two courses that replace ANTH 317. The latter group of students will be encouraged to consult their advisor about which of these courses they should take if they choose only to take one course. Most of our students have room for several free electives in their programs.

We do not anticipate changes in student numbers as a result of this change or in the enrollments in other Anthropology classes. The course is not required by any other programs or departments.
