

Part II. Description of Curriculum Change

1. New course description

CO 362 Unix and C

3c-01-3sh

Prerequisites: CO 310 or permission of instructor

An introduction to the history, features, syntax, and applications of Unix and C. Lectures, reading, and hands-on projects. Coverage includes two or more command interfaces, variations in C, and portability issues.

2. Old course description

CO 362 Unix and C

3c-01-3sh

Prerequisites: CO 310 or permission of instructor

Provides a general introduction to UNIX and C including historical roots, current practice, prospects for the future, and hands-on skills. Students will develop understanding of the features, syntax, and "culture" of UNIX and C through lectures, reading, and projects. UNIX and C will be studied both separately and in synergistic combination. Upon completion of the course, students will have immediately practical awareness and some skills and will be provided with a foundation for further coursework in operating systems, compiler construction, and/or graduate study. UNIX is a trademark of Bell Laboratories.
