3. This request for a change in prefix corresponds to a change in the departmental name, one that more accurately associates the curriculum with its educational discipline, rather than with a center that is managed by the department as is the current case. Henceforth, the Center, Learning Enhancement, as well as the department's various programs will be under the framework of the departmental name, *Developmental Studies*. The prefix for the courses managed and taught by the faculty of the department would change from LRNC to DVST.

The Registrar has agreed that this change will not pose a problem and that its implementation would begin with Summer 2006. (e-mail communication attached).

Following is the organizational outline:

The Department of Developmental Studies

Through its curriculum, center, and programs, the Department of Developmental Studies provides IUP students with courses and services designed to enhance the development of all students.

Undergraduate Courses

Courses are open to all students and include 1) developmental courses in math and reading; 2) learning enhancement courses in mathematics and critical reading; 3) college success courses in introduction to higher education, college learning strategies, and career development; and 4) courses in preparing undergraduates in roles as paraprofessional peer educators.

Center and Programs: Helping students prepare, advance and excel.

The Center for Learning Enhancement offers a range of programs designed to promote the success, satisfaction, and intellectual development of all IUP students through academic assistance, learning enhancement, and college success and retention programs:

Peer Assistance Program includes walk-in tutoring in a wide range of disciplines and courses, plus workshops in study strategies and other academic success topics.

Supplemental Instruction (SI) Program provides small-group study/review sessions for sections of courses with difficult content or high levels of failure and withdrawal rates. Peer leaders guide students on how to learn course content.

Developmental Advisement Program provides students with both curricular and educational advisement, monitoring, guiding, and referral of students as they progress through the college experience.

The First Year Experience Program provides a first-year program of freshman success courses that include Introduction to Higher Education (DVST 150); Learning Strategies (DVST 160); and Career Exploration (DVST 170). These 1-credit courses may be taken individually or as a package, depending on the students' needs and interests.

Linked Courses Program coordinates clusters of 2, 3 or 4 courses designed to form a learning community of students for whom course content may be linked by theme, with applied critical reading strategies, with math, with applied learning strategies and/or with Supplemental Instruction.

CUSP (College Undergraduate Success Program) is an early entrance freshman experience for first-year students, scheduled during the week before Fall Term. The experience includes enrollment in a 1-credit course, Introduction to Higher Education (DVST 150); workshops; seminars; tours; and other informational and social activities.

Act 101 Program provides a comprehensive first-year experience to students who qualify for the Pennsylvania State Act 101 Program. The program includes educational and developmental advising, the first-year experience courses, academic courses in math and/or critical reading skills, and the services of the Peer Assistance Programs.

R. Benjamin Wiley Partnership Program is a multi-year outreach program that prepares students from urban high schools in Pennsylvania to attend college. Successful students are invited to matriculate through the PSSHE schools, a large number of whom enroll at IUP.

Paraprofessional Peer Educator Program prepares selected students for the role of a paraprofessional peer educator within the higher education setting. Roles include SI Leaders, Peer Tutors, Workshop Leaders, and Peer Advisors.
