Part II. Description of Curriculum Change

1. Delete EC382 Urban Economics.
2. This is the rationale for the revision of EC383 Regional Economics and the rationale for the deletion of EC382 Urban Economics. EC382 Urban Economics has not been taught for five years. It has become impossible to separate the economics of urban areas from the economics of regions. Urban areas are within regions and are consequently a part of regional economies. The material of central importance that used to be taught in the urban economics course has therefore always been treated to some degree in EC383 Regional Economics. It is proposed that this situation now be formalized and that the urban content within regional economics be increased to include all the material of central importance.
3. The change will result in an increased emphasis upon urban economics within EC383 Regional Economics, and will not affect any other courses or affect any program. These courses are electives for economics majors and any other students. They will not be affected except that if they choose to take EC383 they will have an enhanced exposure to the economics of urban areas.

Part III. Letters of Support

Since EC382 Urban Economics has not been taught for five years, its deletion is not going to affect any department, including the Department of Economics.
