Rationale for Proposed Changes	
(A) Why is the program being revised?*	<p>The current Composition and TESOL program has not undergone major revisions since 2000. Our proposed revision of the program reflects our new vision of the program as interdisciplinary by design rather than as a program that would appear to have two separate foci (one on composition and one on TESOL).</p> <p>We are also proposing an update to the program:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To reflect broader and more current critiques and understandings of how the term TESOL(Teaching English as a Second or Other Language) can be seen to reflect a deficit model of language acquisition. Applied Linguistics is a broader term and encompasses more approaches than those typically seen under the term TESOL. To broaden the appeal of the program to those interested in teaching languages other than English. Understanding composition for multilingual individuals is not theoretically limited to those whose focus is English. To address international understandings that the term TESOL is often linked with MA-level pedagogical programs. Some scholarship agencies have taken our current program off of their approved list (for example SACM) simply because we have the term TESOL in our program name and they associate that term with MA level programs.

The core courses provide a foundation for students to specialize in composition or TESOL or both. This foundation is flexible enough to meet students' individual needs and those of the academic marketplace.</p> <p>The core curriculum connects theory with practice and is designed to increase the professional qualifications and teaching effectiveness of instructors in teaching positions. The Composition and TESOL Program began in 1975 and was revised in 1986 and again in 2000.</p> <p>The Composition and TESOL Program recognizes the changing structure of education and the interdisciplinary nature of research into the nature and transmission of literacy. It provides central courses in research methods, technology and literacy, and language theory and offers options for a 9-credit specialization in Composition or TESOL. Doctoral students may begin the program in the summer or fall and must start with ENGTL 800 and ENGL 808. Students have 15 elective hours in the program, with courses offered in rhetoric, reading theory, and literacy theory. In addition, students may take courses from other programs, or they may opt to take the second specialization in the CT Program.</p> <p>The program emphasizes the flexible yet intensive preparation of instructors of literacy. To achieve this flexibility, the program permits variation in the fields of concentration. All students study a common body of knowledge in central courses and focus their research on the uses of interdisciplinary knowledge for the transmission of literacy in the teaching of English. A unique feature is that students can select an academic year or a summers-only program option.</p>	<p>P ro p o s e d N ar ra ti ve C at al o g D e s c ri p ti on</p> <p><i>(if c h a n gi n g)</i></p> <p>Indiana University of Pennsylvania's doctoral program in Composition and Applied Linguistics provides students with a comprehensive, interdisciplinary, and critical research-based understanding of first and second language literacy. With accomplished, international faculty in the fields of Composition, TESOL, Rhetoric, and Applied Linguistics, our program offers students the unique experience of working across disciplinary lines and integrating research on language, multi-literacies, writing, digital rhetoric, and culture. The program began in 1975 and is one of the longest running of its kind.</p> <p>Our curriculum is built on the concept of the teacher-scholar. Doctoral students in the program conduct innovative research, and we promote teaching practices that are informed by current scholarship. Graduates become accomplished teacher-scholars known for their innovative research, teaching, and publications. The program leads to careers as faculty members, literacy researchers, writing center and writing program directors, academic administrators, and expert consultants.</p> <p>The Composition and Applied Linguistics program is one of the few programs in the world designed to give students the option of exploring both first and second language literacies. We welcome students who wish to explore the ever-widening contexts of literacy and language around the world and who recognize the value, beauty, and social relevance of literacy research and pedagogy.</p> <p>The Composition and Applied Linguistics program is also one of the few Ph.D. programs to offer two residency options: a regular academic year cohort and a summer's only cohort.</p>
