## Part II. Description of Curricular Change

## 1. Proposed Catalog Descriptions:

**RGPL 342 Physiography** 

3 class hours 0 lab hours 3 credits (3c-0l-3cr)

Focuses on landform types and their spatial distribution. Emphasizes the tectonic forces that build landforms and the weathering and erosional processes that erode and shape surface features. The relationship between human activities and landforms is also considered. (Also offered as GEOG 342; may not be taken for duplicate credit).

**GEOG 342 Physiography** 

3 class hours 0 lab hours 3 credits (3c-0l-3cr)

Focuses on landform types and their spatial distribution. Emphasizes the tectonic forces that build landforms and the weathering and erosional processes that erode and shape surface features. The relationship between human activities and landforms is also considered. (Also offered as RGPL 342; may not be taken for duplicate credit).

## 2. Listing of Proposed Changes:

This course is being crosslisted as RGPL 342 -- it is already listed in the catalog as GEOG 342. The "(Also offered as RGPL . . . ) is being added to the Geography description.

## 3. Rationale for Changes:

The rationale for crosslisting Physiography is that the course is a track course for students who have a Regional Planning major with an Environmental emphasis. We feel that it would be advantageous for Regional Planning students to be able to register for courses within their program that are listed as RGPL rather than GEOG. The crosslisting will also enable faculty in the department to correctly designate their course teaching load within the planning program, for accreditation and other purposes.
