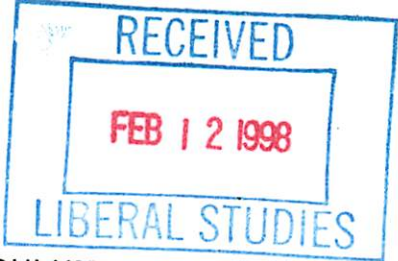

b. List of All Changes for Regional Planning/ Town Manager Track.

- 1) Addition of RP 333 Trade and Transportation to the Town Manager Track.
- 2) Liberal Studies and Foreign Language numbers are changing to be more accurate.

3) Rationale for the Addition of RP 333 Trade and Transportation to the Town Manager Track.

All town managers must work closely with all levels of highway planning in considering its impact on the region. It was an oversight on our part in the setting up the Town Manager Track to not include **RP 333 Trade and Transportation** in the list of possible track courses.

- 1) The revision will offer students currently in the program an additional choice.
- 2) The program revision will not impact teaching loads, Trade and Transportation is currently part of the curriculum. It will likely be offered every other year.
