SUBJECT: Proposed Modification of Geology Minor

The Geoscience Department requests that the requirement for the Geology minor be increased from 15 to 17 credits. The Geology minor would then consist of General Geology I and II Lecture/Laboratory (total 8 credits) and three upper level courses in Geology (total 9 credits). This will produce a more substantial minor than the present one which can be completed by taking the 8 credit General Geology I and II Lecture/Laboratory Sequence, two upper level geology courses and a one-credit course.

This proposal was approved by the Geoscience Department on February 24, 1986, and by the Advisory Committee of the College of Natural Sciences and Mathematics on April 11, 1986. (see attached memo of April 24, 1986, from Dr. Fuget).
