Part II.1 Description of Curriculum Change

I. Catalog Description

INDS 218 Computer Technology for Interior Design **1 class hour**
3 lab hours
3 credits
(1c-3l-3cr)

Introduces basic computer-aided drafting and design (CADD) for designers; emphasizes CADD theory and the value of the computer as a problem solving, design tool.

Course outcomes:

- Define basic CADD terminology.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the role of CADD in the design process.
- Apply CADD theory to design problem solving.
- Utilize CADD to interpret and apply principles and elements of design.
- Utilize CADD to analyze information and assess two-dimensional design relationships.
- Utilize CADD to analyze information and assess three-dimensional design relationships.
- Effectively apply CADD to reproduce existing drawings and create working drawings.

II. Proposed Changes

Old Title/Number: INDS 218 – Drafting for Construction II
Old Catalog Description: INDS 218 Drafting for Construction II 1c-3l-3cr
Prerequisite: INDS 118
Introduces basic computer-aided drafting and design (CADD) for designers; emphasizes CADD theory and the value of the computer as a problem solving, design tool.

New Title/Number: INDS 218 – Computer Technology for Interior Design
Remove the prerequisite

III. Justification

Current name is misleading to students and not reflective of the catalog description; the course objectives and the name change address those issues. The original course titles were misleading in that 118 is hand drafting and other "graphics" and 218 is computer based drawing, various programs; they are independent one from the other.
