The Consumer Services Department proposes to delete the courses that comprised the former College of Human Ecology Requirements substituting courses that better meet the objectives of the major. The number of semester hours required will be unchanged. Specifically:

Rationale for Change

The proposed required courses are necessary to meet Foundation of Interior Design Education Research (FIDER) accreditation standards.

The change also reflects the need to better meet the objective of the major as evidenced by survey of alums, professionals in the field, and professional standards. The current requirements reflect the former College of Human Ecology requirements.
