- 1. The SOC prefix is amended to include SOWK (now SOC/SOWK).
- 2. Students taking the Minor in Sociology/Human Service will be required to take at least one 300 or 400 level course as one of their electives.

### c. Rationale for changes

- 1. All of our programmatic language is being adjusted to SOC/SOWK to reflect the reactivation of SOWK 238.
- 2. With the reactivation of SOWK 238, students potentially could fulfill the minor requirements with only 200 level *electives*. The proposed change is intended to strengthen the Minor and better prepare students by ensuring that they take a minimum of one upper level *elective*.
