SUBJECT: Adjustments to Requirements for Majors

TO: UWUCC

FROM: Charles D. Cashdollar, Diane Duntley, Ronald Juliette

Last Spring, because we were all aware that Liberal Studies implementation would compel certain adjustments to degree requirements for majors, you directed the three of us to survey the situation, contact departments, and prepare recommendations for your action. You asked us to divide the changes into categories so that you could approve "routine" adjustments without extended consideration.

We met during the summer, drew up preliminary proposals, and sent those to departments. We have most of the responses back, and are submitting to you, for your action, this report.

Remaining programs will be submitted to you as soon as we receive replies from departments.

A sheet explaining our "categories" is attached.

CATEGORIES: ADJUSTMENTS TO DEGREE REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Routine:
- a. Courses prescribed under GE continue to be prescribed under LS (for instance a program requiring CH 111-112 as the laboratory science continues to require that as the Science option under LS).
- b. No change in free electives beyond the 1-3 sh alteration implied in changing from 52 sh General Education package to a 53-55 sh Liberal Studies package.
- 2. Slight:
- a. Calls for one of the following:
 - (1) deleting a course prescribed under GE because it will not meet criteria for LS and the department does not choose to preserve the requirement in any other way
 - (2) moving a course prescribed under GE to the major because it will not meet LS regulations. This will increase the major by one course and decrease free electives equivalently.
 - (3) moving a course from a list of courses required by the major to LS because it will be appropriate as a LS course. This will increase free electives.
- b. Makes no other changes beyond the usual 1-3 sh adjustment in free electives.
- 3. <u>Significant</u>: Involves changes of sufficient magnitude that we have asked the department to submit a "Change of Program" proposal to the UWUCC.

In both programs, BE 335 Business Machines is currently prescribed as a Gen Ed Natural Science/Math elective. ASBED does not believe the course will meet criteria for Liberal Studies electives nor does ASBED wish to add the course to its major.

ACTION: delete the requirement. [ASBED intends to incorporate the material into other courses, and when current students have been phased out, it will likely ask to delete BE 335 as a course.]

Move PY 151/161 from a list of "other requirements for the major" to the LS Electives category. This allows the degree program to stay at 125-126 sh rather than rising from 126 to 128-129.

Move B1 150 to LS; keep P9 151/101 in "Other requirements! Means changing total credits from 126 to 128-29 since other science requirements cannot be used in LS electives. Unless to preserve at least one LS elective for student choice rather than prescribe all of them.
