## Double Dipping for Liberal Studies Requirements

Help students strategize about how to select courses that enable them to double (or even triple!) dip with their major, Liberal Studies, and GMA-type requirements. Review a student's requirements for the major, minor, or any certificates. Compare the required courses to the options available to fulfill LS requirements. Encourage students to select courses that tick off two or three boxes with one class. Remember the LS courses cannot carry the same prefix as their major.

**Example:** A student with a BSED in Social Studies Education can take ANTH 110 to fulfill their required anthropology course for the major, one of their liberal studies social science courses, and their liberal studies Global and Multicultural Awareness requirement. Thus, one class fulfills three requirements.

### REMINDERS

- 1) Specific courses may be required or recommended by colleges or major departments; see degree program outlines for specifications.
- 2) No course prefix may be used more than once for the 9 credits of Social Science LS requirements.
- 3) No course carrying the student's major prefix may be used.
- 4) No course prefix may be used more than once, except for intermediate-level foreign language prefixes (CHIN, FRNC, GRMN, JAPN, KORE, and SPAN), which may be used twice.

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
