

Event Recap: IUP Athletic Hall of Fame Introduces Five Former Kinesiology, Health, & Sport Science Majors

On Saturday, September 9th, IUP's Athletic Hall of Fame received new inductees with a class of 10 former athletes, 2 long-time athletic trainers and one team. The department's 28th total induction class included multiple individuals who had come through IUP's Kinesiology, Health & Sports Science programs.

Brianna Liebold ('11), Women's Track & Field Nominee

Liebold starred as a two time NCAA indoor All-American in the long jump, and one time in the outdoor long jump. With this, she was named 2010 USTFCCCA Atlantic Region Field Athlete of the Year, PSAC indoor field athlete of the year (2010, 2011), and seven total PSAC championships in jumping events throughout her IUP career, among other awards. Away from Track & Field, Brianna graduated in 2011 with a Bachelor of Arts in sports administration.



Jaclyn Rutkowski ('07), Women's Lacrosse Nominee

Rutkowski was one of IUP's greats in women's lacrosse, compiling 162 points and 58 assists in her career, IUP's leader in both categories. She was voted All-PSAC First Team in 2007, and left as second in program history for career goals at 134. She also owns the single-game program records for goals (9) and assists (8) in IUP history. In the classroom, Jaclyn graduated in 2007 with a Bachelor of Science degree in health and physical education.

Chris Morgan ('08,'09M), Football Nominee

Chris was the 2006 offensive player of the year in the PSAC West, where he rushed for 1,318 yards, a top 10 mark in program history for a single season. He holds additional honors as All-PSAC 2nd team in 2004. In his collegiate career he amassed 3,817 rushing yards (third in program history), and 34 touchdowns. He left IUP in 2008 with a Masters degree in sports administration and a Bachelors of Science in sports administration (2008).

Frank & Ronald Trenney ('92), Athletic Training Nominees

Brothers Frank and Ronald Trenney both had worked in the sports medicine department for IUP, spanning over 30 years. Combined, they hold more than 60 years of athletic training experience. Having worked with 100+ IUP student-athletes, they were essential to the behind the scenes of dozens of championships and school records. Frank and Ronald graduated in 1992 with degrees in health/physical education and health/physical training, respectively.
