

The celebration/remembrance of our "leader of the band," **Dan DiCicco**, in September was moving and uplifting. More than fifty alumni returned for what was a weekend of sharing, reminiscing and music making. We are, once again, preparing for our Heinz Hall Gala concert, "IUP Plays Pittsburgh" on Monday, November 2nd at 7:30 p.m. The IUP Wind Ensemble, Marching Band, Trombone Choir, Opera Workshop, and the Keystone Brass will be the ensembles performing. A solo piano performance by our newest faculty member, **Henry Wong Doe**, will round out the program. A feature of the evening will be music by Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra "Composer of the Year", Richard Danielpour. Dr. Danielpour will be in attendance and will make remarks to the audience on his two compositions being performed.



Memorial concert for Dr. Dan DiCicco held

On Sunday, September 27, 2009, a memorial concert was held for **Dr. Daniel DiCicco**. "Doc" taught at IUP for 33 years, was Director of Bands Emeritus, and passed away on February 3, 2009.

The IUP Wind Ensemble, Jazz Ensemble, and Marching Band, ensembles that Doc directed during his years at IUP, performed. In addition, an alumni concert band and jazz band were formed and played during the concert. **Dr. David Martnuik**, clarinet, performed the Franz Schubert *Der Hirt auf dem Felsen* with **Dr. Mary Logan-Hastings**, soprano, and **Dr. James Staples**, piano.

Over 50 alumni, spanning 6 decades, participated in the concert. From **Dan Borlawsky** (BS in Ed, 1959) to a quartet of 2009 graduates – **Amanda Crane** (BS in Ed), **Kari Hamilton** (BS in Ed), **Erin Moscony** (BFA), and **Adrienne Radesky** (BFA) – IUP graduates rehearsed throughout the day on Saturday prior to Sunday afternoon's performance.

The IUP Wind Ensemble began the performance with a conductor-less rendition of Percy Grainger's *Irish Tune from County Derry* (Danny Boy). Joining the Wind Ensemble was **Daniel Hunsicker**, grandson of Dr. DiCicco and a clarinetist. Two works by IUP alums **Dr. Gary Ziek** (class of 1981) and **Dr. Jim Self** (class of 1965) were also performed. Zeik's *Four City Portraits* was composed especially for this concert, while Self's *Tour de Force* was the premier performance of this work for band; the orchestral version was premiered previously by the Pacific Symphony.

The Alumni Jazz Band, led by saxophone professor **Dr. Keith Young**, began their set with the *Mellowmen Theme*, composed by *Charlie Davis*, followed by **John Morris**'s arrangement of *Back Home Again in Indiana*. The IUP Jazz Ensemble played works in honor of Doc, including Gary Anderson's arrangement of *Jazz Man* and Frank Mantooth's setting of *Cherokee*.



Steve Barton (class of 1976) directed the Alumni Concert Band in a new edition of Robert Bernat's Indiana Rhapsody. The IUP Jazz Ensemble joined the Alumni Concert Band in a premier performance of W. Roy Mitchell's (class of 1989) IUP Rhapsody. The IUP Marching Band ended the concert with Hail Indiana, the Alma Mater, Phil Collins' Invisible Touch, arranged by Chad Torporski (class of 2009), and Amazing Grace.

Dr. Tony Atwater, IUP's President, **Dr. Jack Stamp**, Chair of the Department of Music, and **Mr. Michael Hood**, Dean of the College of Fine Arts, gave remarks. Doc's daughters, **Darla**, **Dana**, and **Diane**, spoke on behalf of the family.

A Treasure in the Orendorff Music Library

Three years ago the Atlantic Chapter of the Music Library Association met at the University of Pennsylvania. Musicologist Jeffrey Kallberg gave a presentation about an original Beethoven manuscript that was found in a cabinet at the Palmer Theological Seminary in Philadelphia. It was Beethoven's own arrangement of the Grosse Fuge for two pianos. The manuscript sold at Sotheby's in London for an estimated \$1.8 dollars. As I drove back to Indiana, I thought how remarkable it would be to find a Beethoven manuscript like that! When I arrived back at my office, I found a package on my desk. contained an obviously old music score that was found in the Special Collections Department of the IUP Stapleton Library. While it was not a manuscript, it turned out to be a first edition of Beethoven's 4th symphony published in 1823! It is remarkable to realize that Beethoven was still alive when that score was published. Only ten other libraries in the world own a copy. It is just one of many treasures we have in the Orendorff Music Library.

Donna Nagey Robertson (BS in Ed., 1957) is pianist with the Andoin Piano Trio, which gives concerts this fall in Asheville, Brevard, and Mars Hill, North Carolina. Her musical compositions are published by Cantica NOVA Publications, Alry, Oceanna Music, TAP, Northwestern Publications, Wayne Leupold Editions and Sacred Music Press. She is Professor Emerita at Mars Hill College in Mars Hill, NC.

Herb Frombach (B.S. Ed, 1962) married Sandra Raley ('62) and lives in Downingtown, PA. Herb has had over 120 church / school octavos published within the past 10 years. He taught music in the Montour School District for 5 years and retired form a major insurance company after 30 years of service. He is now a freelance composer / lyricist and part-time piano technician.

Jane A. (Diamond) Ross (B.S. Ed. 1967) was widowed in 2008. She has one daughter. Jane retired in 2000 from the Medina City School District, where she taught elementary and junior high music. She also taught for 6 years at Ashland University, and since 2001 has served as Director of Music Ministries at First Christian Church in Wadsworth, Ohio. Jane has a private studio of 17 piano and voice students. She was chosen Professional of the Year in music education in 2008 by Cambridge Who's Who, and also belongs to Marquis Who's Who of American Women.

Dr. Ronald E. Stitt (B.S. Ed, 1969) continues on the faculty of Allegheny College as Director of Jazz, Assistant Director of Bands, and instructor of trombone & euphonium. He is Director of the Erie Concert Band and performs regularly with the Erie Chamber Orchestra, the Erie Opera Theater Orchestra and the Dave Stevens Big Band. He is a founding member of the Allegheny College Faculty Brass Quintet.

Nancy M Bowers (B.S. Ed, 1970) retired after teaching vocal and general music in the North East School District for 30 ½ years. She is the chancel choir director of Park United Methodist Church in North East, PA and also directs the North East Choral Club, which is an all-women's vocal ensemble.

John Hastings (BS in Ed., 1971) is completing his 22nd season as a baritone in the professional chorus of the Pittsburgh Opera.

Ann Marie (Uhl) Robinson (B.S. Ed, 1980) received her Master of Arts degree from Ohio State University in 1997. In her 29th year of teaching, she teaches K-5 vocal music at Carson Elementary School in Newark, Ohio. Among her awards are: Disney Teacher of the Year Nominee in 2006 and Newark School Teacher of the Year in 2008. In 2007 Ann recorded a compact disc of piano music. Their concert program was entitled: "New York Perspectives" and included pieces about New York City written by composers who had lived or who are currently living in New York City.

Joy teaches Primary General Music in the Pine-Richland School District, where she also directs the annual high school musical. 

The **IUP Chorus** was chosen through a blind audition to be featured at the 2009 Conference of the National Collegiate Choral Organization at Yale University in November. Out of forty-one competing choirs nationwide, only nine were selected to perform. This is a distinctive honor for the Music Department, Director **James Dearing** and the 51 singers.

Two students graduated from the IUP Horn Studio last May, Emily Robinson and Chad Toporski. Emily is now in LA and Chad is subbing in the Pittsburgh, Moon Twp. area. In December, Kelly McNamee will graduate. There was one wedding this past summer, Liz Hikes and Steve Brown were married August 1st. The **IUP Saxophone Studio** has been invited to perform at the PMEA Conference on April 22, 2010. The ensemble is directed by Dr. Keith Young and is comprised of all the students in the saxophone studio. This past spring senior saxophonists Justin Polyblank and Justin Canzano won 1st and 2nd place in the Johnstown Symphony Orchestra Young Artist Competition. As 1st prize, Polyblank was given the opportunity to perform the Dubois Concerto for Alto Saxophone with the JSO. He was also the winner of the Butler Symphony Young Artist Competition, where he performed Claude T. Smith's Fantasia for Saxophone and Orchestra.

Members of the **IUP trumpet studio** performed at the International Trumpet Guild conference in Harrisburg, PA on May 28, 2009. This group of 9 students was selected to perform through a competitive, audition process, and premiered two new works for trumpet ensemble. The first work, *Acire*, was composed and directed by 2009 IUP graduate **Jeremy Leidhecker**. The second, *Hawkin' Your Horn*, was composed and conducted by **Dr. David Ferguson**, director of the IUP Trumpet Ensemble.

This fall the Carol Teti Memorial Organ Scholarship Committee (CTMOS), along with IUP Organ Professor **Dr. Christine** Clewell were pleased to present organist Mark King in recital at Zion Lutheran Church, Indiana, PA. Mr. King is currently Minister of Music at Saint John's Episcopal Church in Hagerstown, MD where he conducts the Parish Choir along with the Boy and Girl Choristers, serves as organist for Eucharist and Evensong liturgies, and manages an extensive concert series which features local, national, and international artists. Mark studied organ with Dr. Teti, and piano with Dr. James Staples, from 1978-1982. Mr. King's recital and the wine & cheese reception that followed were hosted by the CTMOS as part of the Fall scholarship fund raising event. Established in 1993 to combat the "vanishing organist," the CTMOS has helped underwrite the organ studies of nearly 30 IUP music students while honoring Dr. Teti's legacy and carrying forth the important mission of bringing world renowned organists to Indiana and providing financial support for capable young organists.

On March 14, 2010 the current IUP scholarship recipients, Marissa (Davis) Bruno and Randall Frye, will be featured in recital at the Heinz Memorial Chapel Student Recital Series in Pittsburgh (Oakland). In December 2008 and May 2009 Marissa and Randall, as well as graduate student Dennis Bell, were invited to perform at this Heinz Student Recital Series. At the December 2008 recital these organists were assisted by the Dunder Mifflin Brass Quintet: George Alberti III, tuba, Jeremy Hetrick, trumpet, James Johnson, trumpet, Jeremy McClaine, horn, Lucille Roderick, trombone. The organ at Heinz Chapel is a three manual, 73 rank Reuter Organ which includes over 4,272 pipes!

IUP alumni and friends are also encouraged to participate in two additional organ-related events. On Friday evening, April 30, 2010 at Zion Lutheran Church the CTMOS will host in recital internationally renowned organist and scholar, Dr. Ann Labounsky (Chairperson of Organ and Sacred Music at Duquesne University, Pittsburgh. A benefit dinner will precede her recital at the Indiana Country Club. Reservations are required for this dinner, however there is no RSVP request for the reception, which follows her 7:30 PM recital. The Committee will host the Fourth Annual Carol Teti Memorial Organ Competition for high schoolage students on Saturday, May 1. Prizes are awarded in the amount of \$1,500, 1st Place, \$1,000 for 2nd Place, and \$500

for 3rd Place. For the Competition we are seeking capable high school-age students from school districts near and far. The final competition round will be an open recital to be held at Zion Lutheran Church, beginning at 1 PM. A reception will immediately follow the competition. Contestant's families, their friends and the general public are urged to support by attending the final round, which will be adjudicated by Dr. Labounsky.

Four flutists participated in last fall's state MTNA competition: Dave Verno, Christine Douglass, Angie Sollenberger and Erin Moscony. Christine Douglass won the state competition and went on to compete in the regional competition.

In a continuation of student and faculty exchanges and collaborations with the Music Academies of Zagreb and Ljubljiana, the IUP Music Department has welcomed two music exchange students from Croatia, voice major **Nela Saric**, and composition major **Antonia Mimica**. Ms. Mimica is studying composition with **Daniel Perlongo**, and both young women are studying voice with **Dr. Mary Hastings** this fall.

Faculty notes:



Dr. Matt Baumer was the program chair for Teaching Music History Day 2009, held at Edinboro University on Saturday, September 12. The conference brought together musicologists and others who teach music history to discuss such as issues as what to include (and what to leave out) of the undergraduate music history sequence, how to make the best use of new technologies (even Wikipedia), and how to foster critical thinking. Graduate students in IUP's music history Master's program also attended the conference.

Dr. Stephanie Caulder has been invited as the guest conductor for the PMEA District 4 band festival at Huntingdon High School on February 11-13, 2010. District 4 includes schools from Centre, Clearfield, Clinton, Fulton, Huntingdon, Juniata, and Mifflin counties. The host of the District 4 PMEA festival is IUP music alumnus and Huntingdon High School band director, Jordan Canner. Dr. Kevin Eisensmith will present a clinic on performance anxiety for the District 4 band directors during this weekend.

Dr. Stanley Chepaitis will premier the new orchestral version of his composition Paganini in the Vernacular with the Orchard Park Symphony Orchestra (Buffalo, NY area) on February 12, 2010. Music Director David Rudge will be the conductor with Dr. Chepaitis, solo violin.

Dr. Zach Collins. Assistant Professor of Tuba and Euphonium at Indiana University of Pennsylvania, is featured on a new CD release by Southwest Chamber Music on Cambria Recordings. The three-CD set catalogs all of composer William Kraft's *Encounters*. Of the 15 *Encounters*, Encounters II for Solo Tuba is the only one that does not feature percussion. *En*counters II is one of the landmark pieces in the solo repertoire for the tuba. Written in 1966 for Roger Bobo, it explores the extremes of tonal range, dynamics, and articulation as well as the extended technique capabilities of the instrument such as multiphonics. The Southwest Chamber Music project is the culmination of two years of live performances and recordings. Both the live performances and recordings of Kraft's Encounters were produced in close collaboration with the composer. The CD is available through most major retailers and is also on iTunes.

In March of 2009 Dr. Stanley Chepaitis (violin) and Dr. Mary Logan **Hastings** (voice) traveled by invitation to Zagreb, Croatia and Ljubljiana, Slovenia, where they gave master classes and performed in concert at two highly acclaimed European music conservatories. Both concerts included unique compositions and arrangements with various combinations of violin, viola, and voice, with piano accompaniment provided by Zagreb Faculty member, Julie Gubaidulline. IUP student Kevin **Huhn**, who was on an exchange with the Zagreb Music Academy that spring. also assisted in some jazz standards on the string bass. In February, the IUP music faculty looks forward to a concert of Croation and American songs and a master class given by Zagreb Voice Professor, Cynthia Hansell-Bakic.

Dr. Judith Radell and **Dr. Linda Jennings** presented a program on the

featuring works by Clara Rogers, Mel
Bonis and Rebecca Clarke, highlighting
Dr. Radell's original research into the
works of Clara Rogers.

Dr. Linda Jennings presented several chamber music concerts this past year with various musical ensembles. She presented a concert with Clavio Trio members Deborah Greitzer, violin, and John Fullam, clarinet, at the Frank Lloyd Wright Darwin Martin House, Buffalo, NY. She presented concerts as a member of the Arcadia Piano Trio in Fort Erie, Ontario, Canada and at the University of Central Oklahoma. She also presented master classes at the University of Central Oklahoma and the Universidad de las Americas Puebla, in Mexico. In fall 2008, her article, "Music Beyond the Mountains of Haiti," was featured in Stringboard, Op. 1 of the PADESTA Newsletter, Fall 2008, Volume XI/III, Number 2. During the fall of 2008, Dr. Jennings hosted Ms. Fabienne Fanord for two months in Indiana, where Ms. Fanord received lessons and observed classes. Plans are under way for Ms. Fanord to return in the spring 2010 for further professional development.

Music Librarian **Dr. Carl Rahkonen** and **Dr. Matthew Baumer** hosted the fall meeting of the Allegheny Chapter of the American Musicological Society (AMS) on Saturday, October 17 in Cogswell Hall.
