



## Frequently Asked Questions

*The IUP Writing Center provides one-on-one writing tutoring to students in all majors and programs. The Center is open to students, faculty, and staff for assistance with writing. It's also a quiet, comfortable place to work, fully equipped with a computer lab, printers and a scanner.*

### **W**hat kind of help can I get?

A trained undergraduate or graduate tutor will work with you one-to-one at any stage of your writing assignment—developing ideas, drafting, revising, documenting sources, editing, and more. Tutors can help you to organize ideas, expand main points, and make your writing flow smoothly.

### **W**hat should I bring?

It's a good idea to bring a copy of the assignment and any notes or rough drafts you may have. A print or electronic copy is fine.

### **W**ill a tutor correct my paper for me?

A tutor will help you to correct your paper. The tutor will read through the paper with you and help you to identify mistakes, understand why you made them, and learn to make corrections. We also have MLA and APA handbooks and various other reference books.

### **D**o I need an appointment?

For tutoring in Eicher Hall and the Library Satellite Center, you can just walk in without an appointment. For online tutoring, please visit our website ([iup.edu/writingcenter](http://iup.edu/writingcenter)) to schedule an appointment at least 24 hours in advance.

### **W**ill you tell my instructor that I visited the Writing Center?

At your request, we will send a form to your instructor that states when you visited and what you worked on. Your instructor may take your visits into consideration when assessing your level of effort.
