John Ritter is an American Post Pop artist whose vibrant depictions of celebrities and popular culture have consistently defined the pages of The New Yorker, Time, GQ, the New York Times and Harper's.

Ritter began his career in northern California in the early-1990's, where his unique style and deployment of color landed him a slot on the design team that created and marketed Adobe Photoshop. Since then, Ritter has seen his uncompromising interpretations of film, writers, musicians, and politicians work their way into the collective American psyche.

Never relegating himself to a single format, his work is seen not only in numerous national and international publications, but also in Broadway advertising campaigns, corporate art installations, product packaging, and gallery exhibitions (NYC, San Francisco, and Pittsburgh). His art graces the collections of academy award-nominated composer Lalo Schifrin, financier Lenny Dykstra, producer David Lonner, Las Vegas casino mogul Darin Feinstein, as well as collectors throughout the U.S. and Europe.

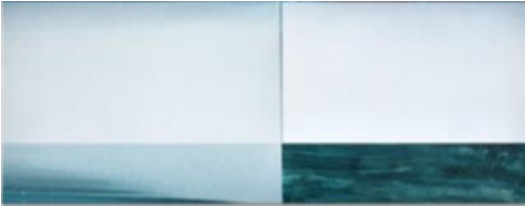

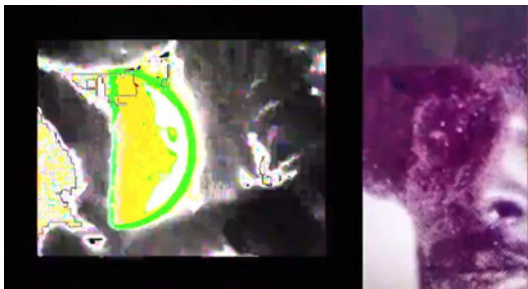

Loring Taoka graduated with an MFA from the University of North Texas. Loring Taoka’s work is an exploration on the digital and the physical. These spaces have become inextricably linked in theory and practice with ideas about truth and authenticity, the known and unknown, and perception serving as a common thread. Through this process, Taoka looks to the ways in which he is read and identified, the ways in which he identifies himself, and works to abstract these notions.

Loring Taoka is a visual artist utilizing a variety of approaches and techniques to explore notions of vagueness and authenticity. Taoka’s work questions the act of perception and what happens when we are presented with precise, yet ambiguous information. His work has been featured in numerous venues such as Western Exhibitions (Chicago, IL), CES Gallery (Los Angeles, CA), and New American Paintings.



ArtsPath is one of 14 organizations in the state that partner with the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts in providing arts-in-education services to schools, senior centers, and other groups where the arts are used in an educational setting. The ArtsPath service region includes Armstrong, Butler, Clarion, Indiana, and Jefferson counties. Through primarily long-term artist residencies, public and private school students, IUP students, and community members work directly with a variety of professional performing and visual artists.

As the arts-in-education program of the Lively Arts, the ArtsPath mission centers on promoting high-quality arts experiences, establishing the use of art in education across all curricula as a priority, offering regional services, generating community-wide and regional support, and promoting the arts classroom teacher as integral to a student's complete education.

Through the Lively Arts Ovations series, regional students enjoy a performance or hands-on activities such as a workshop, master class, or lecture-demonstration, with a professional touring artist.

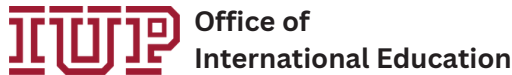
