

TRAVELING BY BUS

Fullington Trailways has several bus routes that run through Indiana. All buses stop at the KCAC Bus Shelter at 711 Pratt Drive. One route travels to and from the Pittsburgh International Airport and State College, PA. The other travels between Buffalo, NY and Pittsburgh. These are daily scheduled departures, and connections with other bus carriers can be made in these cities to any place in the United States.

The Indiana County Transit Authority operates regular local routes via its IndiGO buses. All IUP students ride free with their I-Cards. IndiGO has 12 routes and an IUP Park-n-Ride that runs across campus. The other routes frequent popular places in town, such as Walmart, the mall, Indiana Regional Medical Center, Regency Mall, and the larger housing complexes in town.

There is also a Megabus stop in Pittsburgh that travels to Philadelphia via State College, PA.

TRAVELING BY AIR

The best option for getting to Indiana by air is via Pittsburgh International Airport (jimmystewartairport.com/), which is approximately 75 miles west of Indiana.

There are also airports in Latrobe, PA, Arnold Palmer Regional Airport (palmerairport.com/airport/), Johnstown, Airport (flyjohnstownairport.com), and the Indiana County Airport. All are smaller, regional airports, located within 35 miles of IUP. Securing travel to and from the airport should be carefully considered when making travel arrangements.

RIDESHARE/ CAR RENTAL

Uber and Lyft do operate in Indiana but are subject to driver availability.

Enterprise Carshare allows for an option for students to rent a car at an hourly or daily rate. There are also other rental car companies in town.

PARKING

Students do have the option of bringing their cars to campus and paying for a permit to park it in either the parking garage at \$475 per year or in the Robertshaw Lot on the south end of campus for \$225 per year.

TRAVELING BY TRAIN

Amtrak services destinations east and west of Indiana. The Pennsylvanian Route travels from Pittsburgh to New York City via Philadelphia and makes sixteen stops along the way, including Greensburg, Latrobe, Johnstown, and Altoona. The closest stations are Latrobe going west (approximately 27 miles) and Johnstown going east (approximately 27 miles).

Amtrak offers many other routes that can be found online. As with flying, travel to and from the train station should be carefully considered when making travel arrangements.
