

## APPLICATION FOR AN ECONOMICS MINOR

To complete a minor in economics, the student must complete 18 credits in economics including Principles of Macroeconomics (ECON 121) and Principles of Microeconomics (ECON 122). The other 12 credits are met by completing any 200-level, 300-level, or 400-level economics class with an ECON prefix with at least 6 credits 300-level or higher. The student must also maintain at least a minimum 2.00 GPA in economics.

To ensure credit for the minor, the student must complete and submit this form to the Department of Economics (213 McElhane Hall). Upon graduation, the Department of Economics will verify that the student has met the requirements for the minor. If so, the minor will be indicated on their official transcript.
