Welcome to this edition of the Dept. of Counseling Newsletter. Another busy academic year has come to a close. The first cohort began taking classes in the Monroeville community counseling program this past January (see article in opposite column). We are now actively recruiting new students for a 2nd cohort to begin this fall. New

students began to enroll in the revised 48-credit school and community counseling programs and in the license only program. The newly formed Department of Counseling Advisory Board had its first meeting and we are seeking additional community counseling alumni to serve on this Board (see article on page 5).

Monroeville Community Counseling Cohort



The Department admitted the first cohort for the MA Community Counseling Program in Monroeville. Twenty students completed their first two classes, taught by Ms. L'Amoreaux and Dr. Witchel. The students bring a wide range of work experiences, from mental health, nursing, education, substance abuse, and related areas. They enroll in two courses per semester, allowing them to obtain their degree in eight semesters. As you can tell from the above picture, Nadene's newly acquired rabbit ears show how vibrant this group can be.

The program, administered by George Rogers, Assistant Dean, School of Continuing Education and coordinated by Dr. Witchel, is housed at the Monroeville Graduate and Professional Center, located in the Monroeville Mall Complex. The Center includes state-of-the-art educational facilities, and recent renovations added classroom space, a computer lab, and a classroom for distance education.

We are currently recruiting applicants for the cohort to begin in September 2000. Our goal is to admit an additional 25 students, and to begin a new cohort each September. Dr. Dandeneau continues her work as part of the SCI Pine Grove Evaluation Team. This summer, she and other members of the evaluation team will be trained along with the newly hired staff members of the institution. Once the prison is completed and in operation, the evaluation team research office will actually be located on-site. Dr. Dandeneau is quite thrilled to have the opportunity to work so closely with the prison staff and community.

Dr. Fontaine, recently appointed to the editorial Board of the Professional School Counseling journal, has had a busy spring, with three major professional presentations in four weeks. She copresented a program "Culturally Competent Counseling: A Transgender Knowledge Base for Counselors" with Kathy Wilson, Outreach Director for the Denver Gender Identity Center, at the American Counselina Association National Conference in Washington, D.C. She also delivered an invited presentation at the Child and Adolescent Service System Program (CASSP) conference at Penn State on adolescent sexual minority issues. Dr. Fontaine co-presented with Dr. Dandeneau at the Pennsylvania School Counselor's Association annual conference in Hershey on how to supervise interns.

Dr. Fontaine was selected as a Trainer for the ASCA Train the Trainers project to facilitate workshops on the National Standards for School Counseling Programs. She will attend the ASCA national conference in Cherry Hill, NJ in June for a training workshop.

She and Dr. Guth are busy organizing the inaugural meeting of the Department's newly created Advisory Board, which will have its first meeting on May 10th. As coordinator for the Department's graduation ceremony, Spinelli Scholarship award, graduate assistantships selection process and outstanding student award, these end of the year activities keep her quite busy with teaching and field placement site visits tucked into her schedule as well.

They are beginning the data collection for these projects. Dr. Guth was also awarded a mini-technology grant from the College of Education.

Dr. Guth recently became an IUP Safe Zone member. Safe Zone members offer information, sensitivity, and understanding towards lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender issues on campus. Dr. Guth was the Awards Committee Co-chair for the Association for Specialists in Group Work and recently participated in the awards ceremony at the ASGW luncheon during the ACA conference in Washington. Ms. L'Amoreaux is completing the final phases of her doctoral dissertation entitled, "Children diagnosed with ADHD and their perceptions of parental helpfulness with homework: A Q methodological study." An article she co-authored with colleagues from Kent State University entitled "Setting up on-line support groups using the Palace software" will be published in the June issue of the Journal for Specialists in Group Work.

Nadene taught Counseling Across the Lifespan for the Monroeville program cohort during spring and she is developing a new elective, "Family Issues in Counseling", offered this summer.

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Dr. Witchel has been busy coordinating the new Community Counseling program in Monroeville, including advisory students, teaching, marketing the program, and recruiting new students.

As mentioned in Dr. Guth's overview, Dr. Witchel and Selma Witchel, M.D. (Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh) are involved with two grant-funded projects assessing the life experiences of persons born with mixed genitalia. Part of the research project is to identify the need for counselors to provide services to individuals and families affected by this birth condition. Bob recently attended a workshop in Boston on Genital Ambiguity and outcomes of gender assignment.

In June, Dr. Witchel will be attending the American Academy of Psychotherapists (AAP) Summer Workshop in Sedona, AZ. As a part of this experience he will be participating in an ancient Inipi Sweat Lodge ritual, which can accelerate and intensify the therapeutic process. He is also planning a therapeutic ropes course experience for the Monroeville cohort to be facilitated by the Hero's Journey Programs staff; website is: http://www.herosjourneyprograms.com/

Dr. Witchel recently received a mini-technology grant from the college of Education for his work on the Department's web sites, and for power point presentations he developed for his courses.

Dr. Worzbyt is in the process of completing the <u>Caring Children Make Caring Choices</u> grant project. Three trainings were scheduled during fall 1999 throughout PA. Dr. Worzbyt has written a chapter for the new enhanced PA Driver's Education Manual to be published in Spring 2000. He continues to review articles for the <u>Journal of Research in Rural Education</u> and recently reviewed the first draft of a child counseling book for Allyn & Bacon Publishers.

Dr. Worzbyt continues to work with Drs. O'Rourke & Dandeneau in writing the 2nd edition of <u>Elementary School Counseling: A Blueprint for</u> <u>Today and Tomorrow</u> to be published by Accelerated Development Inc., a Division of Taylor & Frances. A final project is entitled <u>Guidance on</u> <u>Five Minutes A Day</u>. Dr. Worzbyt is looking for classroom guidance activities (elementary & middle school) that can be completed in 5 minutes

Working with Tammy Wolfe and Julie Valenti, the program specialists of the PPT program, was a leadership team composed three students, Laurie Khalouf, J.W. Sawtelle, & Laura Gordon (shown above). They coordinated the program including a "wake-up" motivational speech by Dr. John Worzbyt. Additionally, students in the CE 636 class conducted a needs assessment with the youth involved in the PPT program to plan the overall content of the workshop. The results of the needs assessment were then used to design and create four targeted mini-sessions in the following areas: Matching Interest to Careers; Skills to Obtain Jobs; Resources: Copina Community Skills. Dr. Dandeneau is appreciative of all the work her CE 636 students put into this event. It was their hard work and willingness to actively engage in the class assignment that made the day a great success.
