

## CURRICULUM CHECKLIST: ECONOMICS PRE-LAW MAJORS

All IUP students must pass at least 120 credit hours (cr) with a minimum 2.0 grade point average (GPA) to graduate. Courses fall within three groups: the economics major, liberal studies (LS), and free electives.

*Liberal studies electives (6 cr):*

At least one course must be 200-level or higher. Courses with the prefix of a student's primary major do **not** count. **Some** courses needed to fulfill the College language requirement may be used but should be checked in the *Undergraduate Catalog*. No course prefix may be used more than once, except for some intermediate-level foreign language prefixes (CHIN, FRNC, GRMN, JAPN, and SPAN), which may be used twice.
