<sup>(1)</sup> Performance majors must register for a total of 8 ensembles for credit (1 each). All other ensembles may be taken for 0 or 1 credit (provided that the student is carrying 18cr without ensembles in a given semester).

<sup>\*</sup> Regarding Controlled Electives: All BFA majors require 8cr of ensembles, plus 4-12cr of area-specific controlled electives (see checklist for specific courses). In addition, all majors require additional controlled electives of APMU, MUSC, or MUHI courses, which may not include ensembles. The additional controlled electives for each major are: Vocal 1-2cr (depends on whether foreign language is 3 or 4cr); Keyboard 7cr, Strings 8cr (this can include multiple semesters of MUSC 403), Composition 4cr, and Wind & Perc. 11cr.

## **Special Requirements**

- 1. Each student must declare a primary performing medium. Those who elect voice as their primary instrument normally elect piano as a secondary instrument. Performance juries are held at the end of each semester. Students are expected to complete the requirements for their performing area and level. Piano proficiency is required in all degree programs.
- 2. Ensemble participation of five hours a week is required each semester. Students are required to participate in at least one primary (major) ensemble on their primary instrument (including voice) and one secondary (minor) ensemble each semester. Primary ensembles include: Marching Band, Symphony Band, Concert Band, Symphony Orchestra, Wind Ensemble, Chorale, and Chorus. For guitar majors or other majors whose instrument is not included in these major ensembles, the department chair will assign alternative ensembles. Students may fulfill this departmental requirement by participating in either 1-credit or 0-credit ensemble(s). In meeting the degree requirements of 4-8 credits of ensemble credit, enrollment in credit-bearing ensembles is flexible across semesters.
- 3. Students must register for MUSC 475 (Music Lab) and attend (1) departmental meetings or recitals, (2) all department and area recitals, and (3) eight campus recitals and concerts each semester in attendance.
