Indiana University of Pennsylvania Proposed Five-Year, Priority Capital Project Spending Plan FY2024-25 Submission

In accordance with Board of Governors Policy 2000-02-A: *Capital Facilities Planning, Programming, and Funding*, please find for your endorsement the Indiana University of Pennsylvania annual submission for Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education Capital Project Spending Plan for FY2024-25.

This submission is due to the State System's Office of the Chancellor by May 1, 2025.

The capital project spending plan is a rolling, five-year plan in which the State System Board of Governors approves funding for the execution of requested projects in the first year of the plan and tentatively approves funding to execute requested projects for the remaining five years, subject to annual updates and reviews.

The annual capital project spending plan approval process includes the following steps:

Presentation to the President's Cabinet—January 27, 2025

Presentation to and approval by the Senate Development and Finance Committee – January 30, 2025 Information Item to the full University Senate—February 4, 2025

Presentation to and endorsement by the IUP Council of Trustees—March 6, 2025 Submission to the State System's Office of the Chancellor—May 1, 2025

Review and approval by the State System Board of Governors—October 9, 10, 2025 The following

motion will be presented for approval at the public meeting.
