Readmission: Students Returning to IUP

There is no one way to complete university. Some students leave temporarily but return to pursue their degree. Encouraging someone to come back to the IUP community can be a challenge, but reenrollment does not have to be a difficult process.

Not in Good Academic Standing

Regardless of voluntary leave or dismissed by the university, student must submit reenrollment application (up to 2 weeks before the start of the semester)

An <u>Academic Standards</u>
<u>officer</u> reviews application and
makes decisions

Involuntary Withdrawal

Student *first* submit a request for reenrollment to the vice principal for Student Affairs

Second, students submit the application for reenrollment (found in MyIUP Academics tab)

Graduate student wishing to reenroll must contact the <u>School</u> of Graduate Studies and <u>Research</u>

Fresh Start Policy

Students who have been away from IUP for **2 or more calendar years** can apply for this reenrollment program. Individuals must meet the current degree requirements. A student's transcript will have all their credits and grades recorded before reenrollment, but their cumulative GPA will be calculated "based on the credits and grades earned from the data of reenrollment."

(Review Fresh Start Policy in full.)

Students must meet SAP requirements in order to receive financial aid. Federal regulations require the Financial Aid Office to use *all* academic statistics



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
