














#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR CAROUSEL "APRESENTAÇÃO"

Twice each semester we will have consecutive days of "carousel" presentations in which we will organize the classroom like a **large expo**. Each student partner team will do a **5 minute presentation** several times in a row, with a rotating audience. The following day, we will switch audience/presenters and the remaining student partner teams will present several times in a row, with a rotating audience.

When not presenting, you should be listening carefully and **participating actively**: speaking in Portuguese, asking good questions, listening closely, and filling out a questionnaire about the presentations you hear/see.

**Be sure to create something VISUAL** for your presentation with <u>no more than 20 words total</u>. Something that will make your presentation attractive. Some ideas: posters, PowerPoint, brochures to hand out, photos (real or fake) etc. The visual should be incorporated into your presentation, rather than distracting from it. It should support your research, be visually pleasing to your audience, and be constructed with care.

**Practice, practice.** You should <u>not</u> read anything directly during your presentation. Eye contact and the ability to speak and answer questions spontaneously are important elements of your grade. We will vote on the best overall presentation!
